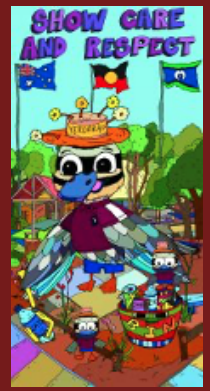

This week was Canteen Week. Thank you to all the P and C, as well as Kathy and the canteen staff for keeping our students' bellies full.



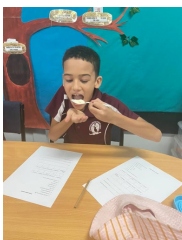
### Pirate Day

## From the desk of Mr Craig Anderson, Gosnells Primary School

Thursday, May 27 will see Gosnells Primary School play host to teams from Wirrabirra Education Support Centre, Ashburton Drive Primary School and Bletchley Park Primary School for our first Inclusive Interschool Sports Carnival. Each school will field 2 teams of 6 children, consisting of students with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) from Years 3 – 6 as well as mainstream peers who demonstrate great sportsmanship and leadership. Teams will compete against each other in 4 games including Big Ball Soccer, European Handball, Multi Ball Rounders and Cricket. With a clear focus on providing opportunities for children with ASD to participate and represent their school with pride, this carnival promises to be like no other. The sports have been chosen specifically as they are able to be adapted and modified to include all students equally. There will be no scoring during any of the games, meaning no points, no scoreboards and no trophies. The carnival will conclude with a certificate presentation to every participant, followed by a shared morning tea/picnic before students head back to their respective schools. Unfortunately, we are unable to accommodate spectators at this event, but we look forward to sharing some of the photos with our community in the next edition of our school newsletter.'

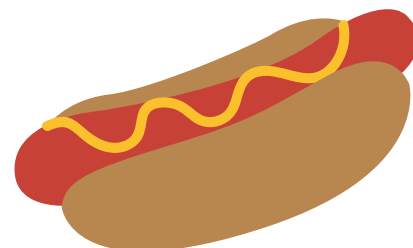

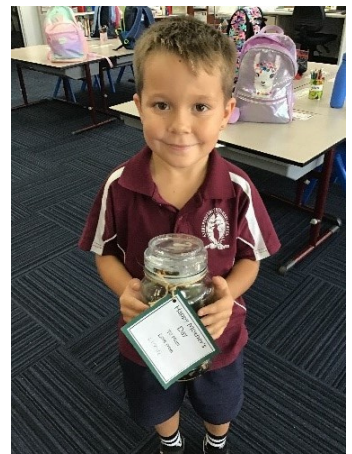
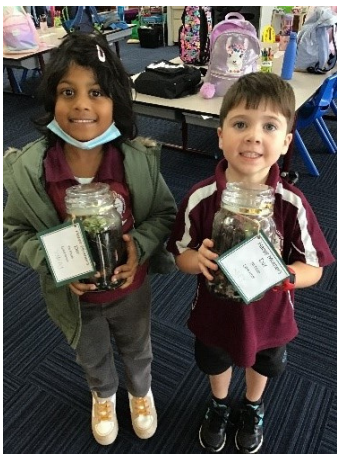


# Room 2: Pre-Primary and Year 1

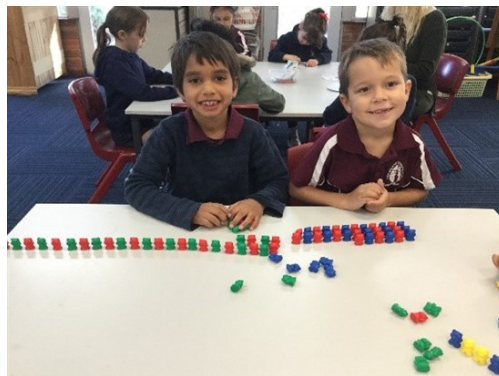
In Room 2 we have been very busy learners. Here are some of the activities we have been enjoying at school.

- A member of Chartered Accountants Aust. & New Zealand; CPA Aust or Institute of Public Accountants; a registered Company Auditor under the Corporations Act 2001
- Or approved by the Commissioner for consumer Protection.

Quotes we have received so far start at \$1500 for each year, which is a lot of fundraising dollars.
