# **Auslan Lote**

During Term 1, I have been introducing Auslan to our pre-primary to year 6 students and staff. Students and staff have been learning about Deaf culture and how to use Auslan greetings, emotions, colours and family in conversations. Using questions and responses has been a focus this term, after learning the topic, as this allows students to apply Auslan into their conversations. Students enjoy participating in Auslan activities such as Auslan Whisper, Bingo, PAC Man, Snowman Word Guess (similar to hangman), Kaboom, Whiteboard Word and Sign Race. The students are remembering what the signs mean and are using fingerspelling with success. I have been impressed with how eager the students are, and how quickly they learn. I enjoy seeing the students applying their knowledge by saying "hello and good morning", "good afternoon" and "how are you?" into their conversations, and when they see me around the school.

Please note that masks are exempt during Auslan LOTE lessons.


