#### COVID-19 Update

On Tuesday 26 April, the Premier announced the easing of several regulations. Starting on Friday 29 April;

- Masks are no longer required to be worn at school. Staff, students, and parents can choose to wear them if they feel more comfortable
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  Parents can attend school assemblies and events
- Household contacts (including students) can attend school; however, they must complete a negative RAT every morning.
- Vaccination mandates remain in place for staff
- If your child tests positive to COVID they must stay home for 7 days and you will need to inform the school

Please continue to notify us if your child becomes Covid positive or a Household contact.

Next week, on Tuesday, our Year 3 and 5 students will begin NAPLAN testing in literacy and numeracy. It is important that our students feel very calm about the assessments and are not put under unnecessary stress. It is important to note that NAPLAN does not inform any of our reporting processes. Whilst we want all our students to do their best during NAPLAN, it is important to remember this assessment only reflects 'one test on one day' and does not reflect everything magnificent we already know about your child as a person and their wonderful achievements every day. We wish all our Year 3 and 5 students the very best next week. If you have any questions or concerns about NAPLAN please speak to your child's teacher.

## **Classroom Item - Physical Education**

Term 1 was a great start to the year in Physical Education. Students engaged in a range of activities and games that developed both their skills and their understanding of the importance of leading healthy and active lifestyles. Our pre-primary - year 2 students focused on developing their fundamental movement skills, in particular locomotor skills (running, hopping, jumping, dodging etc.) and object control skills (throwing, catching, striking etc.). In term 2, they will continue to develop these skills whilst applying them to modified games!















For our year 3 – 6 students, term 1 saw them participating in "striking and fielding" games such as cricket, tee ball and softball. In term 2, these students will focus on "invasion" games which consist of games such as netball, soccer, AFL and hockey. These games allow them to develop and apply their fundamental skills in game scenarios and learn to work together as a team!



















In Senior Sport, students have had the opportunity to learn various sports under the guidance of our fabulous upper-school teachers. In term 1, students worked on their skills for the summer carnival, which was unfortunately postponed. This term students have the option of soccer, AFL, netball and hockey in preparation for our winter carnival.
