Classroom Item - Unit 4

Unit 4 Pre Primary

It has been a very busy term of learning in Pre Primary Unit 4! Here is a small glimpse into what the class has been doing...

Letters and Sounds:

Our wonderful Unit 4 students have started Phase 2 in Letters and Sounds. This means that students are now learning letter names and sounds, and how to use these letters to read/spell words. This class has demonstrated a keen interest in reading and spelling based games and activities, so to supplement our Letters and Sounds session, we had a CVC Word competition! Students were split into teams and given sound cards. They used the cards to spell a word, make sure it was a real word, and then write it down on their whiteboards. All teams were very competitive and successfully created quite a few words (not bad for 5 weeks of learning!). Here are some photos of the competition below.









Talk for Writing:

The class could not believe it... someone had left beans on Miss Bilman's table!! There is only one way to find out if they're magic or not — to grow them! At risk of a beanstalk crashing through our classroom roof, students have started the germination process for these beans to start growing them. Each student chose a bean, folded a piece of paper towel to fit it into the bottom of a cup or jar and they watered the bean on the paper towel. All of the beans were left in a sunny spot in our class and we can't wait to watch them grow.






















Digital Technologies:


During Digital Technologies with Miss Barron, the students have been learning the basics of coding and creating sequences. They have been practising first by using 'unplugged' activities (nontechnology based) to begin creating sequences of instructions. Once they mastered their unplugged sequences, students were able to practice their sequencing with friendly little robots called "Bee Bot's" – navigating their robots to complete a task.











Imaginative Play:

Imaginative play is vital for our early childhood students. It helps to develop social skills, it creates friendships, fosters problem-solving and gives our students an opportunity to practice their speaking and listening skills through conversation and role-play. This term, the students have been running a Florist. Students are in charge of placing and receiving orders, creating flower arrangements, selecting gifts and charging for their services. Students are the ones in charge of maintaining the presentation of the florist, knowing 'a real florist wouldn't have flowers on the floor'. They do a wonderful job of stepping into their roles in the florist to keep it running nicely. The best part is, there is a lot of learning happening in there that they aren't even aware of! Lots of literacy and numeracy opportunities are hidden in this play area.






P&C G General Meeting
