Join the adventure!

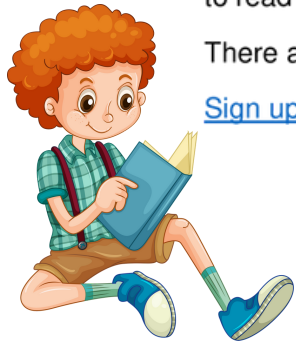

Students took action by participating in a clean-up around the grounds of Ashburton Drive Primary School. They were astonished at the heavy weight of the garbage bag they all collected.

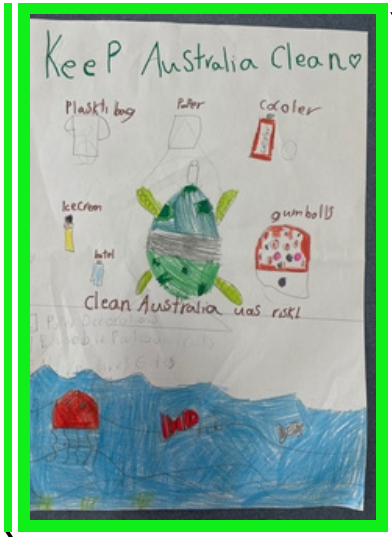
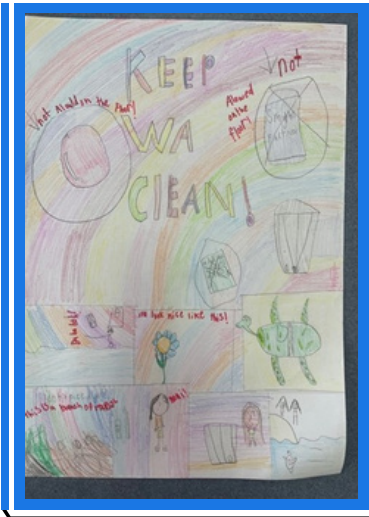
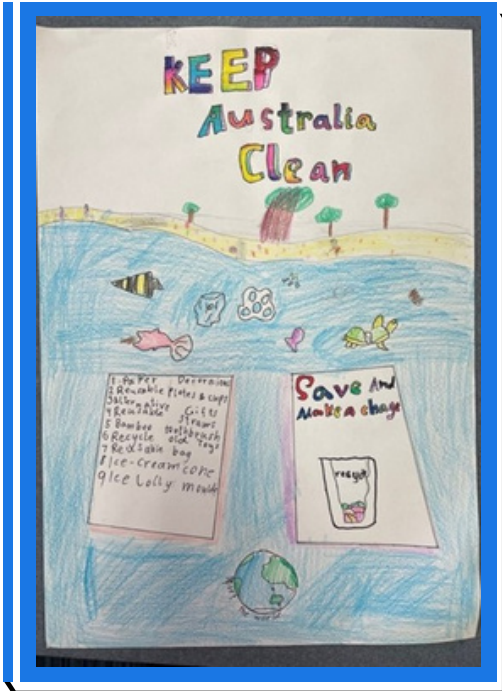
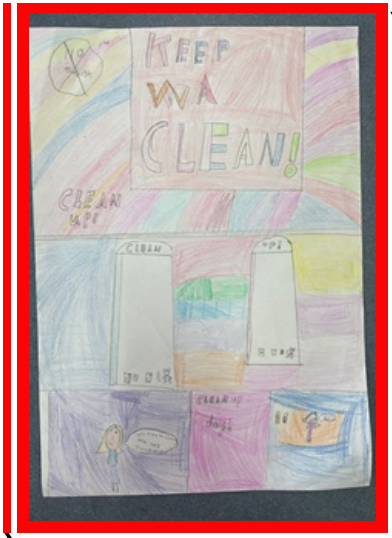
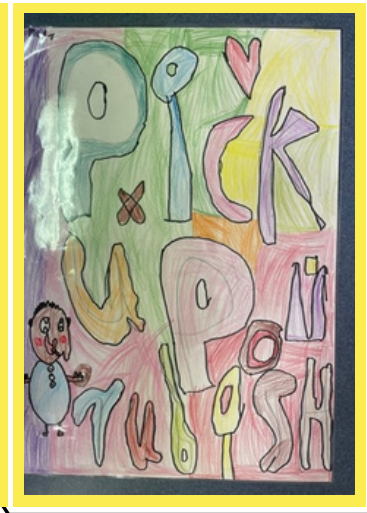
