Design and Technologies

This term students at ADPS have been having a lot of fun designing and creating different structures. Many of these design tasks have been a fun and exciting way of supporting our 'Talk 4 Writing' programs and integrating a lot of skills and concepts into their learning.

Goldilocks and the Three Bears - Kindy

As part of Talk 4 Writing, Kindy students have been learning the Traditional Tale, "Goldilocks and the Three Bears". Children had to use different craft techniques to create their favourite character. They then had to build a suitable bed for their character using different materials. Goldilocks and the Three Bears look very comfortable in their beds. They are not too hard, not too soft, just right!

CAHDS are offering a parent information session at Communicare Cannington. The information session is intended for parents with children'adolescents who experience significant attention difficulties, including a diagnosis of ADHD. The information session topic we will be presenting are:

Communication Presented by CAHDS Senior Speech Pathologist

This workshop aims to provide information to parents about:

communication difficulties (verbal, written and social) as related to ADHD
the impact of communication difficulties both diagnosed and undiagnosed

Social connectedness refers to the relationships people have with others. Social

connectedness is integral to wellbeing. People are defined by their social roles, whether as partners, parents, children, friends, caregivers, teammates, staff or employers, or many other roles. We are connected by the way we communicate with others, including our use of social media and technologies.

Communication skills, both verbal and written, are needed for individuals to build and maintain relationships with others. Developmental language difficulties/disorders a specific learning difficulties/disorders are common in individuals diagnosed with ADHD but are often undiagnosed. Difficulties can lead to or be a part of attentional, behavioural, emotional and academic difficulties.

If parents are interested in attending this session, they will need to register their attendance as places are limited. Please contact Communicare Cannington on parenting@communicare.org.au to register for the session.

Relevant handouts will be provided at the session. There is no cost to attend the session.
