Order instructions

- Log on to <u>www.campion.com.au</u>
- Click on Online ordering for parents and students.
- Create your account (Please note: Creating an account enables you to track your delivery through Australia Post).
- Select your school and enter in your 4-character Resource List code (M66Q), which is on the front page of your resource list.
- Select the year level and then choose the items you want to purchase. Then click continue.
- Enter in your delivery option and complete details.
- Review and complete purchase.
- Once completed an order confirmation will be sent to your email address.

- Orders can still be placed online after your school's cutoff date (Cuttoff date Thursday 15th December 2022), however these are considered late orders and may include additional charges.

This term our Talk for Writing focus has been poetry. We have been learning all about the poem "The Man from Snowy River", and how we can borrow Banjo Patterson's sophisticated writing strategies to support us with our own writing.

To help with writer's block that many of us were experiencing, we completed a "Black out Poetry" activity, in which we manipulated poems to create our own creative pieces. We selected words that stood out to us and used these words to create a new story. Using black markers we 'blacked out' the rest of the text, leaving only our chosen words. Some of us then presented our new poems to the class.









To continue the creative process, we completed a 'brain dump', activity where we recorded any words that came to mind when presented with different images. This helped us retrieve our knowledge about different topics, learn from our peers ideas and inspire creativity. We will be continuing to learn about poetry and will eventually write our very own poems using all our new skills!
