Dress Code

The School Board have reviewed the Dress Code and made a few small changes as follows:

Unisex Clothing

Options include: navy blue shorts or navy blue pants/ track pants, summer dress, tartan skirt, navy blue skorts (skirt with hidden shorts), navy blue sports skirt. NB leggings/bike shorts may only be worn under a skirt.

• Hair Styles

Hair should be neat with shoulder length hair tied back. Hair should not hang across a student's face or cover the eyes due to restricted vision and the risk of conjunctivitis. Hair accessories are preferred in school colours. No JoJo style bows, ie large hair accessories.

• Faction Friday

All students are welcome to wear their faction shirts on Fridays.

ThinkUKnow Parent/Carer Presentation

Our school will be hosting a ThinkUKnow presentation on <u>Thursday 30th March at 4:00pm in the library</u>, and all parents, carers and teachers are encouraged to attend. Students will be participating in sessions with their year groups on the 28th of March, prior to the adult only session.

ThinkUKnow Australia is an evidence based education program delivered nationally to prevent online child sexual exploitation.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank of Australia. The program is delivered in collaboration with policing partners New South Wales Police Force, Northern Territory Police, Queensland Police, South Australia Police, Tasmania Police, Western Australia Police, as well as Neighbourhood Watch Australasia.

The presentation will be delivered by a local law enforcement member and an industry volunteer. The presentation is protechnology and addresses topics including self-generated child abuse material, online grooming, sexual extortion, and importantly encourages help seeking behaviour.

This is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help them to be safe and responsible users of technology.





ROOM 4


Students in room 4 have been learning how to show ten numbers and beyond in different ways.

Students also practise drawing tally marks to show numbers.













We used Unifix cubes by connecting ten cubes into a line and leaving the rest as ones to show place value.


so we can put together some amazing Raffle prizes. We thank you all in advance.
