Waste Sorted Incursion Tuesday 23rd May

The Year 5 students from Room 13 and Room 19 participated in a Waste Audit Incursion. This audit provides us an opportunity to find out how much, and what type of waste is produced by our school. This information then gives us an idea of where to begin our waste minimisation efforts, for example what type of recycling to implement or what type of waste to reduce. Our lovely students got to work, sorting some of our school waste into different categories, and measured each of these to give an approximation of our whole school waste amounts. Students were very relieved to see the gloves and tongs come out and were very surprised to see how much waste we had from only 3 rubbish bags! It is safe to say that these students are now our experts for waste! We will receive our official waste audit figures back shortly and will share these then.

National Sorry Day

National Sorry Day will be observed on the 26th of May. This significant day holds deep meaning for all Australians as we come together to acknowledge and express our sorrow for the historical mistreatment of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

National Sorry Day serves as a reminder of the past injustices inflicted upon the Stolen Generations—children forcibly removed from their families and communities under government policies that aimed to assimilate Indigenous peoples into mainstream society. It is a time to reflect on the profound impact this chapter of our nation's history has had on individuals, families, and entire communities.

While the pain caused by the Stolen Generations can never be fully erased, National Sorry Day provides an opportunity for healing, reconciliation, and renewed commitment to creating a just and equitable future for all Australians. It is a day to recognize the strength and resilience of Indigenous peoples and for us to support their ongoing journey towards healing and self-determination.

Our Coin Frenzy is coming up soon so save your pennies (ok coins) for this one, it will run between 12th-23rd June.


