We are thrilled to share our exciting developments happening in our Design and Technology sessions in Room 19. This term we have been investigating Electrical Circuits and began by identifying and examining the components that make up electrical devices.

Over the past few weeks, our budding innovators have been diving into the world of Electronic Snap Circuits, engaging in hands-on exploration and learning.

#### Students have been:

- 1. Investigating and Designing Through experimentation with Electronic Snap Circuits, our students have been honing their investigative skills, exploring the principles of electricity, circuits, and components. They've been actively engaged in the design process, conceptualizing, and planning their creations.
- 2. Appling Technological Knowledge Using their acquired knowledge, students have been applying key technological concepts to build various electronic circuits. They've had the opportunity to innovate and problem-solve, developing solutions.
- 3. Collaborating and Communicating Collaborative learning has been at the forefront, encouraging teamwork and effective communication among peers. Students have been sharing ideas, tackling challenges together, and presenting their findings. - 4. Reflecting and Understanding Encouraging reflective practice, students have been evaluating their designs, identifying strengths, and considering areas for improvement.
