School Start and Finish Times

Classes start each morning at 8.45am and finish at 2.45pm. Please ensure your children are here on time and picked up on time. Arriving late and being left to wait after school can be stressful for your children and cause them anxiety. Children should arrive at school around 8.30 and be collected at 2.45 pm, unless they are involved in Run Club. If your child arrives at school before 8.30am they need to either wait under the shelters on the oval or join in during Run Club or read in the library. This is to ensure that they are safe. Parents who accompany their children at this time also need to comply to assist staff in their Duty of Care requirements. Children will be sent to classes at 8.35 to prepare for the school day. Teachers are available after school or at other times by appointment – please make contact by email, Connect or phone.

The relationship between the home and the school plays a very important part in a child's education. We cannot overestimate the critical role parents play in successful learning: parents contribute much to their child's development and are the most important influences on the way in which the child approaches learning. Teachers are responsible for the more formal aspects of children's learning, and successful teaching builds on the home experiences of the child. This is most effective where there is an active partnership with parents. Two-way communication is a critical factor in the partnership between parents and the school. Where a partnership exists, it is easier for parents to feel confident about the teaching and learning taking place in the classroom and to solve problems. Please help us by:

- Keeping your contact details up to date in the school office
- Checking Connect for any messages
- Keeping the teacher/administration informed of any issues or changes that may impact your child at school
- Contacting your child's teacher if you have any questions or concerns
- Contacting the Principal/Deputy Principal if you have any questions or concerns
- Signing in when on school grounds
- Returning permissions which are sought for various reasons

The school and the Department of Education have clear steps to guide parents in the resolution of problems and concerns and copies of this are available in the school office. However, if you are not sure what to do please don't hesitate to contact me if you have concerns.

Please ensure your child has a water bottle every day. During these ridiculously hot days there have often been times it is necessary to enact our Hot Weather Policy. Students remain in classrooms during extreme heat and physical activities are cancelled. Let's hope for some lovely days soon!

Unit 4 Newsletter

What a wonderful start to the year we have had in Pre-Primary! Students have been busy settling in and getting to know their peers. We have been enjoying many learning activities so far and would love to share what we are doing.

Numeracy

In Mathematics, we are learning to count to 10 using the one-to-one counting strategy. We have been using lots of hands-on materials to count and manipulate and playing games to increase our understanding.











Literacy

In literacy we have been working on our pre-writing skills by developing our fine motor skills. Some of these activities included sticker art, line tracing and colour sorting using the tongs. We have also begun the Letters and Sounds program where we have learnt the letter S sound. In Talk4Writing we started the nursery rhyme 'Incy Wincy Spider.' We have practised memorising the rhyme using a story map and creating actions. After we had learnt the nursery rhyme, a few students went and created a waterspout using the wooden blocks and spiders! Many students joined to sing along with them.






















