Respectful Relationships (RRE)

Yesterday, our Year 5 and 6 students had the valuable opportunity to hear from a local Police Sergeant, who spoke about the importance of respectful language and its role in building and maintaining positive relationships. He highlighted that respectful communication is essential throughout all stages of life and plays a key role in creating safer, more supportive communities.

This visit was organised in response to a recent rise in the use of inappropriate language among students. As part of a multi-faceted approach to address this issue, we are delivering targeted classroom lessons, maintaining consistent staff expectations, applying clear consequences, and hosting impactful guest presentations such as this. Our goal is to empower students to become respectful communicators and positive bystanders who contribute to a safe and inclusive school environment.

We extend our sincere thanks to the parent who assisted in arranging this valuable session. Respectful language has been a strong focus across the school this term through the Respectful Relationships Education (RRE) program, which supports students in developing empathy, emotional regulation, conflict resolution skills, and respectful communication. These lessons align with the Health and Wellbeing outcomes of the Western Australian Curriculum and reflect our whole-school commitment to student wellbeing.

Eliza, who previously taught at our school, has since dedicated herself to extensive study in the field of ADHD and is now recognised for her expertise in supporting students with attention and regulation challenges. Her session introduced staff to the latest science around ADHD, along with practical strategies to better support students in the classroom.

This was a highly engaging and well-received workshop, reinforcing our school's commitment to inclusive, evidence-based teaching practices. If you have any concerns about how ADHD may be impacting your child's learning, we encourage you to speak directly with their classroom teacher to explore available support.



CfC Carnival Drawing Competition 2025

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- The CfC Camival Drawing Competition is open to **primary school students** who attend schools in the Cities of Armadale, Gosnells, and the
 Shire of Serpentine Jarrahdale.
- 2. A maximum of one entry per student is permitted.
- Artwork must be created using the official drawing template provided by Communities for Children (CfC) Southeast Metro. The template can be supplied via email or as printed copies delivered to the school.
- Students may use crayons, pens, pencils, or paint for their artwork.
 One winning design will be chosen for each of the 3 I GAs and printed.
- One winning design will be chosen for each of the 3 LGAs and printed in single colour (black or white) on drawstring backpacks. These backpacks will be distributed at the Carnival.
- Each participating school will have one winner. Winners will receive a \$20 gift card, and their artwork will be displayed at the carnival.
- The decision of the judging panel is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.
- All entries must include a signed Parent/Guardian Permission Form (provided by CfC) to be eligible for consideration.
- Entries must be received by Friday, 23 August 2025. Late entries will not be accented.
- 10. By submitting an entry, participants and their parent/guardian agree that:
 - The entrant retains copyright of the artwork, but grants permission to Communities for Children to reproduce the artwork for use in the drawing competition, in promotional materials, on drawstring backpacks, and at the CIC Carnival 2025.
 - The entrant's first name, age, and LGA may be used in connection with the artwork in promotional materials and at the carnival.

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- No other personal information about the entrant will be published.
- If they wish to remove consent, they must contact us in writing via email to retract the ongoing rights for use of the drawing.
- Communities for Children Southeast Metro will make reasonable efforts to ensure that credit is given to the student artist wherever their artwork is used.
