

Chatty Chaplain Corner

Today we explore the true meaning of gift giving. The word "gift" comes from the Greek charis, meaning grace or an undeserved gift reminding us that real gifts are given freely out of love, not as payment for good behaviour. Promising treats for chores or good behaviour is actually a reward, not a true gift.

Children feel most loved when gifts are given with warmth and thoughtfulness. It's not about the cost, but the love behind it. Even everyday items like school shoes can feel special if wrapped nicely or given as a surprise. If gifts are expected rather than appreciated, they lose their meaning.

Parents should also consider the message a gift sends and remember that presents can never replace emotional closeness and time together. This is especially important for separated families — expensive gifts can't substitute for genuine connection and may cause problems later.

Some children feel especially loved through receiving gifts. For these children, the way a gift is given matters as much as the gift itself. Small surprises, thoughtful wrapping, or hiding treats in lunchboxes can make them feel truly valued.

Above all, gifts should be sincere tokens of love, reminding our children that they are cherished simply for who they are.

Acts of service can show our children they are truly loved. Our goal as parents isn't simply to please our children, but to fill their 'love tank' so they feel secure and cared for. Children who feel loved are more likely to show kindness and serve others in return.

It's important to serve our children with love and patience, while also teaching them independence — not doing everything for them or forcing them to be just like us. Everyday acts like helping with schoolwork, tucking them into bed, or lending a hand when they're in a rush all communicate love when done thoughtfully.

If your child's primary love language is acts of service, these gestures matter even more. This doesn't mean saying yes to every request, but it does mean responding with care. Children learn to care for others by watching us, not just listening to what we say. When they see us serve others with genuine kindness, they learn to do the same.

Above all, serving our family is an expression of love that shapes our children's hearts for years to come.
