"The more that you read, the more things you will know." - Dr. Seuss

At Ashburton Drive Primary School, we know that reading at home plays a big part in helping children develop into confident and capable learners. In the early years, even just ten minutes a day of sharing a book together can make a huge difference. Reading to your child helps them hear the rhythm and richness of language, builds their vocabulary, and shows them that books are a source of enjoyment as well as learning. These simple moments of shared reading also strengthen the bond between parent and child, making reading a time to look forward to.

There are many easy ways families can make reading part of their routine. Visit your local library together and let your child choose books that spark their interest. Read stories aloud at bedtime, take turns reading pages, or simply talk about the pictures and what might happen next. Even older children benefit from being read to, as it models fluent reading and encourages discussion. Building these habits early lays the foundation for lifelong skills in reading, comprehension, and learning across all areas.

As one author put it, "Children are made readers on the laps of their parents." Why not make reading a part of your family's daily routine this week, or plan a fun trip to the library to discover some new favourites?

Classroom Item - Science

Exploring Chemistry in Term 3

This term in Science, our focus is on Chemistry — an exciting branch of science that begins in primary school by helping students make sense of the physical world around them. Through hands-on activities and guided investigations, students are encouraged to ask questions, make observations, and discover how different materials and substances behave.

In Years 1 and 2, students are exploring the different common materials that objects are made from and considering what makes these materials suitable for their purposes. Recently, our Year 1 students enjoyed a lively lesson on elasticity. Each student was given a balloon and observed how it expanded when inflated and contracted when deflated. To finish, we held a friendly competition to see whose balloon could travel the furthest — a great way to combine fun with learning!

Our Year 3 and 4 students are developing their understanding of the three states of matter: solids, liquids, and gases. They are investigating how matter changes from one state to another and how temperature and other factors can affect these changes.

Meanwhile, Year 5 and 6 students are diving deeper into the world of chemistry by exploring mixtures, reactions, solutions, and suspensions. They are learning to identify examples of these in everyday life and experimenting to see how substances interact when combined.

We're also looking forward to Science Week, which will take place later this term. This will be a fantastic opportunity to celebrate "all things science" with a variety of activities, challenges, and events designed to inspire curiosity and creativity.

It's shaping up to be a term filled with discovery, experimentation, and excitement — a wonderful reminder that science is all around us, waiting to be explored!


